
FALL CAMPOREE (Continued)

NEW VERSION OF CHIPPEWA KITCHEN



One of our best camp gadgets to date is the double tripod Chippewa Kitchen. On Friday evening at the Camporee, it was put together under the direction of Tripp Collins who took the initiative to use a copy of the above diagram as a guide. The frame was lashed together with 6', 8' and 10' spars. The cooking platform consisted of the 3' ladder rungs and 3 1/2' floor pieces from our old towers. These were held in place with binder's twine using a "pigtail lashing" like making a raft. It took seven Scouts to carry the structure into position between the dining flies. After covering the platform with about 2" of mineral soil, it was used by the whole troop for all Dutch Oven and Foil Cooking. The platform yielded a good 16 square feet of cooking area. An 8-quart pot was hung from the 8' tripod over an open fire for boiling water.
